What is Stormwater Pollution?

Heavy rainfall or rainwater falling onto hard surfaces can create stormwater. Stormwater runs off the land, picking up pollutants such as candy wrappers, lawn clippings, motor oil, or fertilizers. Stormwater carries these pollutants, now referred to as stormwater pollution, down the storm drain and into the nearest waterway. Stormwater pollution can harm or kill fish and crab species while making our beautiful coast look trashy.



What is Storm Drain Marking?



Storm drain marking is a way to visually remind those about stormwater pollution in efforts to keep everything but water out of the drain. educate others on stormwater pollution prevention.

MPC's Storm Drain Marking Program is a wonderful way for adults, youth, scouts, or community groups to get involved to help communities protect their local environment.
